

**KSCHOOL OF EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT CHAIRS COUNCIL
October 17, 2002**

Present: Peter Barile, Nancy Bihlmeyer, Pam Brucker, Jim Granfield, Norris Haynes, Rod Lane, Sharon Misasi, and Brian Perkins.

Minutes of September 19, 2002, were approved.

Dean Lane handed out the revised resolution proposal dated October 9, 2002, and endorsement recommendations by Ted Sergi, Commissioner of Education. The Elementary Endorsement be set for K-6 (it is presently valid for grades 1-6); the Special Education Endorsement be set for K-12 (it is presently valid for grades 1-12); and repeal the certification regulations that are due to take effect July 1, 2003.

Dean's Council wants the departments to think about their needs. This will be passed onto Institutional Advancement. Responses from chairs:

Counseling and School Psychology. Norris Haynes reported that the transition from the previous chair to him is going fine.

Education. Peter Barile reported that the department continues to cut adjunct usage for Spring 2003 because of budget cuts. Jim Granfield is now coordinating the New Haven Cohort Program in Education.

Educational Leadership. Brian Perkins explained that the department is working through several challenges and making changes where needed. The 6th year enrollment is high, and they are working on changes for the new standards. The department will host an international conference April 18 and 19, 2003, on international law, policy and practice. Several school districts have contacted him and are interested in a cohort program.

Exercise Science. Sharon Misasi said that portfolios are coming in, and Jean Mee is setting up a management system.

Special Education/Reading. Dean Lane introduced Pam Brucker as the new chair, and everyone welcomed her. The department is working toward NCATE approval. Students are doing clinic experiences off campus and using professional development schools for summer.

Dean Lane adjourned the meeting early so that the chairs could attend the Learning Solution Workshop in Buley Library. The workshop includes hand-on demonstrations in the computer lab. CSU Chancellor Bill Cibes and SCSU President Michael Adanti are among the speakers.
