

Professor Simon Rogerson BSc FBCS FIMIS MCMi FRSA

Simon Rogerson is Director of the Centre for Computing and Social Responsibility at De Montfort University, UK. He is Europe's first Professor in Computer Ethics and was named one of the world's top five experts in the field at the World Technology Awards 2003. He received the 2000 IFIP Namur Award for outstanding contributions to the creation of awareness of the social implications of information technology and was awarded a Visiting Research Professorship for 2005 in the Centre for Applied Philosophy and Public Ethics, at Australian National University, Canberra. In 2005 he became the first non-American to be given the prestigious SIGCAS "Making a Difference Award" by the Association for Computing Machinery. He is a member of the British Computer Society Ethics Forum Strategic Panel, a member of the British Parliamentary Information Technology Committee, and Vice President and Council Member of the Institute for the Management of Information Systems.

Following a successful industrial career, where he held managerial posts in the computer field, he now combines research, lecturing and consultancy in the management, organisational and ethical aspects of information and communication technologies. He has published widely and presented papers, many by invitation, throughout the world. He regularly advises government and industry policy makers on ethics and information technology. His current research focuses on technological assessment, ethical systems development and qualitative stakeholder analysis. He is co-editor of the *Journal of Information, Communication and Ethics and Society*. He conceived and co-directs the ETHICOMP conference series on the ethical impacts of information technology and is responsible for creating the world's leading reference World Wide Web site on computer ethics.
