# Dr. Liliana Minaya-Rowe

**Senior Researcher Johns Hopkins University to speak on:**

A Data Driven Agenda for Research and Reform in Educating  
English Language Learners

**Liliana Minaya-Rowe, Ph.D.**, is a Researcher at Johns Hopkins University's Center for Data-Driven Reform in Education. She is co-principal investigator with Margarita Calderón on the Carnegie Foundation of New York *Project ExC-ELL: Expediting Comprehension for English-language Learners* to implement a staff development program for secondary school content area teachers who have English-language learners in their classrooms. She is also Professor Emeritus of the Neag School of Education at the University of Connecticut. Her research interests, publications and teaching include teacher education, literacy, two-way bilingual and ESL program development. At the University of Connecticut, she developed a program of specialization in bilingual multicultural education, taught graduate courses and graduated 300+ students. Dr. Minaya-Rowe has recently edited *Teacher Training and Effective Pedagogy in the Context of Student Diversity*, co-authored with Margarita Calderón *Designing and Implementing Two-Way Bilingual Programs*, co-authored with Virginia González and Thomas Yawkey *English as a second language teaching and learning: Classroom applications for Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students*, and has published over 120 articles, chapters, books and teacher training manuals and guidebooks.
