

HUMAN RESEARCH PROTECTION PROGRAM

The University requires integrity and ethical and moral conduct in all research performed by its faculty, students, and staff. The Human Research Protection Program (HRPP) is responsible for safeguarding the rights and welfare of human participants in research and assures appropriate conformity with both University and Federal mandates for project design and investigator behavior. Investigators engaging in human participant research must submit a project proposal to the HRPP Institutional Review Board (IRB), where it will be examined for requisite compliance and assigned a disposition. Recruitment of human participants for research cannot proceed without IRB approval or exemption.
