

Resolution on the Continuation of the Current Academic Dishonesty Policy

Whereas it is expected that the CSUS Board of Trustees will adopt revisions to the Student Conduct and Disciplinary Code (BR04/55, dated October 7, 2004) prior to the first day of classes of the 2009-2010 academic year;

And, whereas the revisions with respect to Academic Dishonesty will assign to the faculty of each University, the responsibility to establish academic integrity conduct standards and the disciplinary procedures to adjudicate claims made that these standards have been violated;

And, whereas there is insufficient time in the current semester for the Faculty Senate to develop and adopt an SCSU-specific academic dishonesty policy prior to the start of the 2009-2010 academic year;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Faculty Senate endorses the continuation of the Academic Dishonesty policy and procedures contained in BR 04/55 for 2009-2010 academic year, until such time as the Faculty Senate adopts a substitute policy.
