

CSU PROFILE: 2005-06

A COMPENDIUM OF DATA PRESENTED IN TABULAR AND GRAPHIC FORMATS

Enrollment At-a-Glance: Fall 2005

◆ Total Enrollment

- ◆ **Overall**, enrollment was virtually unchanged systemwide from fall 2004, declining by only 44 students—minus 0.1%. However, FTE enrollment, based on the number of credits students are taking, is 1.3% above last year's mark.
 - ◆ Female/Male balance is 59/41
 - ◆ Enrollment of students of color increased from 15.7% to 16.2%.
 - ◆ Connecticut Residents make up **93%** of the student body
 - ◆ Average age is 25
- ◆ **Full-time** enrollment continues a growth trend that began in 1996, with a 2.4% increase over fall 2004. This fall, two out of three students (66.8%) attend full time. FTE of full-time enrollment is up 2.3%.
 - ◆ Undergraduate FT headcount is 2.1% (460 students) over fall 2004; graduate student FT headcount is 5.6% (97 students) above last fall, giving CSU its **highest ever overall FT headcount** (23,698).
 - ◆ Central increased by 2.5%; FTE increased by 2.2%
 - ◆ Eastern increased by 1.6%; FTE increased by 1.5%
 - ◆ Southern increased by 2.2%; FTE increased by 2.4%
 - ◆ Western increased by 3.2%; FTE increased by 2.9%
- ◆ **Part-time** enrollment continues to decline; except for a slight increase in fall 2000, total PT headcount is the lowest since fall 1982. Overall, part-time headcount declined by 4.8% (-601 students) from fall 2004 (12,396 to 11,795).
 - ◆ Central decreased by 4.5%
 - ◆ Eastern decreased by 7.7%
 - ◆ Southern decreased by 4.2%
 - ◆ Western decreased by 5.4%

◆ Undergraduate Enrollment

- ◆ total undergraduate headcount increased slightly from fall 2004, showing a modest growth of 0.5%.
- ◆ 79% of the total student body are undergraduates
- ◆ 78% of all undergraduates are attending full-time (up from 75% last fall)
- ◆ 93% are Connecticut residents
- ◆ 38.5% of all full-time undergraduates live in university housing
- ◆ The female/male ratio is 56/44

- ◆ The percentage of undergraduates of color in the student body—at 17.5%—is up from 17.3% in 2004
- ◆ The average age is 23
- ◆ Full-time undergraduate students are carrying an average of 14.3 hours, up from 14.2 last fall; PT students are carrying an average of 6.2 hours, up from 6.1 last fall.

◆ **Graduate Enrollment**

- ◆ Headcount is about 2.5% lower than last fall, its second consecutive decline.
- ◆ Attendance by graduate students is overwhelmingly part-time [76%—but declining for the fourth consecutive year].
- ◆ Women outnumber men by a 7:3 ratio.
- ◆ 92% are CT Residents
- ◆ The percentage of graduate students of color increased from 10.2% in 2004 to 11.1% this fall

◆ **New First-year Undergraduates** (first-time in higher education; degree-seeking), increased slightly (1.2%) from the 2004 class (4,365 to 4,418).

- ◆ The number of applications for **full-time** admission increased by 1.1%
- ◆ percentage of students who were accepted for admission dropped slightly [60.2% compared to 61.5% in 2004 and 73% in 1997]
- ◆ percentage of those admitted who enrolled increased from 41.2% in 2004 to 41.7% this fall.

◆ **New Undergraduate Transfer Students** enrolling in degree programs declined slightly from last fall (2,750 to 2,631); this is the first time in eight years that there has been a decline.

◆ **Enrollment by Town** Each of the 169 Connecticut towns is represented in the CSU student body. The city of Danbury sends more students to CSU (1,437), predominantly to Western (1,275), than any other city or town in the state. Seventeen towns sent more than 500 students each, accounting for 35% of CSU's total enrollment.
