Accept your Financial Aid Award

•Log into Banner Web to view/accept your award.

Awards are based on full-time status (12 credits per semester). If you plan on attending part-time, notify our office immediately by submitting a Change of Award Form.

Complete Title IV Authorization and Loan Requirements

- •Log on to Banner Web and answer two Title IV Authorization Questions.
- •If you accept a Direct Loan, complete Direct Loan Entrance Counseling and a Master Promissory Note at studentaid. gov
- •If your parent wishes to apply for a Direct plus loan, the application is available at studentaid. gov

If approved, they must complete a plus Promissory Note. If denied, you will be offered an additional Unsubsidized Direct Loan.

Fall Semester Bills are Due July 15, 2022. Plan ahead!

- •Your financial aid will not credit towards your bill unless all requirements are met.
- If you have been awarded a scholarship, forward the information to our office to add to your account.
- •If you do not have enough financial aid to cover your bill, consider enrolling in a payment plan (southernct.edu / studentaccounts), or pursue a private loan with a lender of your choice.

Once you are registered for classes, charges will be generated under 'Current Activity'.

- They will receive an email with a temporary password to log in.

Step 3: Grant access to Parents/3rd Party to discuss bill In order for us to speak to anyone except for you about your account you need to assign them a 4-digit pin code.

- Go to Billing/Payments
- Select "Grant access to parents/3rd party to discuss bill"

Step 4: Set up Direct Deposit

- Go to Billing/Payments
- Select "Sign Up for Direct Deposit"

Step 5: Make Payment

You can make payment in full, or enroll in a payment plan. If you want to establish a payment plan, **do not** make payment first, the payment plan will guide you through the plan set up and collect the payment at the end.

Payment is due upon registration if registering after the bill due date, or when registering for winter, spring break, or summer session.

Payment Plans

SCSU offers interest free payment plans for fall, spring and summer! Payment plans must be established when payment of financial aid cannot satisfy your balance in full by the due date.

The first payment and a \$45 enrollment fee are due at the time of enrollment. Payment plans are due on the 15th of the month thereafter.




