PROGRAMS

The Center of Excellence on Autism Spectrum Disorders takes a comprehensive and multidimensional approach to supporting the ASD community. This involves a combination of training professionals, conducting research to inform best practices, and directly delivering services to individuals with ASD and their families.

Video Series Professional Educator

A 20-part series developed to help bridge gaps that may occur in the classroom. Each program is about 40-minutes and are available through our website free of charge. Driving with ASD

Through partnerships with area police departments, the Center offers one-day events wherein police officers and individuals receive tools and training to successfully navigate a routine traffic stop. The event culminates in a hands-on practice where individuals experience a routine traffic stop with a patrol officer. The event allows both parties to learn from one another and prepare for real life encounters.

First Responders

The Center offers an online, selfguided, training program on ASD for First Responders. The program includes information first responders should know when assisting a person with ASD and practical tips for interacting during an emergency. Connecticut first responders receive CEUs for completion.

Educator Programs

With the focus on preparing teachers to be successful when working with autistic students in their classrooms, the Center develops training programs for school systems that highlight best practices. These programs are tailored to the specific needs of the district, classroom, and age range. They can be provided in person, remotely, or in a hybrid fashion.

Caregiver Training

The Center offers trainings to educate babysitters, grandparents, forster parents, and any shortterm caregivers on caring for those with ASD.

Conferences

The Center provides in-person and virtual conferences for the ASD community. Topics vary from year to year but always focus on the cutting edge of research and evidence based practice. Staff are also available to speak at professional conferences on a case-by-case basis.


